**Memorandum of Understanding
Between**

YORK UNIVERSITY**

Graduate School of Management, St. Petersburg State University (hereafter referred to as GSOM) and Schulich School of Business, York University (hereafter referred to as SSB) believing the extension and strengthening of exchange and co-operation to be of mutual value to their universities and to the development of understanding between our peoples, hereby record their intentions to promote academic, educational exchange and executive education between their universities through the following activities:

Academic Board Membership

Dezso J. Horvath, the Dean of the Schulich School of Business, York University will continue serving on the Advisory Board of the Graduate School of Management, St. Petersburg State University

Student Exchange

Each university may send BBA students to the other university for student exchange as described in the attached agreement for BBA/iBBA student exchange program.

Both universities agree that the exchange program for degree training should follow the educational system and regulations of the Host Institution. Students must submit their applications to the other faculty through their own university.

Development of and exchange at the MBA level will be entered upon further development of relations between the schools and establishment of such program at the Graduate School of Management, St. Petersburg State University.

Visiting Research Fellows

Either university may nominate one or more of its upper year PhD students to visit the other university for purpose of advanced study or research, subject to the approval of the host university and securing international student visa. The host university will provide institutional courtesies, library and research facilities and office space.

Visiting scholars and Co-operative Research

Co-operative research is to be encouraged as individual scholars or departments establish contact and develop mutual interests. Either university may nominate one or more of its faculty to visit the other university for purpose of advanced study or research, subject to the approval of the host university. The cost and conditions of such agreements will be negotiated individually.

Executive Development Programs

It is agreed to co-operate on the development of non-degree programming related to the general subject area of management and commerce in the St. Petersburg area. In addition the parties may agree to cooperate in other areas of Russia that are of mutual interest.

The interest is in the provision of open executive and management education programs, but particularly in the provision of custom programs for private and state-owned enterprises, government and not-for-profit organizations.

Terms of Co-operation


The terms of co-operation for each specific activity implemented under this Memorandum of Understanding shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of that activity.

Any such agreement entered into, as outlined above, will form an Appendix to this Memorandum of Understanding.

Renewal, Termination and Amendment


This agreement for co-operation becomes effective on the date of signature. It may be amended by agreement of the parties.
